Bristol Bay: Through the **Lookina Glass** Past, Present and Future Guest Editorial by Matt Luck

The Past

I first set foot in Bristol Bay in 1979, stepping off an airplane in King Salmon as part of the annual summer migration of commercial fishermen who flocked to southwest Alaska.

The wild sockeye salmon run had begun to rebound from the meager returns of the early- to mid-1970s. In 1973, the entire sockeye return to Bristol Bay totaled only 2.3 million fish. Acutely aware of the resource crisis, the Alaska Department of Fish and Game management biologists invoked strict harvest restrictions and the majority of those 2.3 million fish were allowed to return to spawning grounds. Favorable rearing and ocean conditions combined with ADF&G's swift, decisive response to the predicament was extremely effective. In 1979, six years later, 38 million sockeye returned to Bristol Bay. Of those, 18 million were allowed to escape into the major river systems, a testament to Alaska's commitment to resource stewardship and responsible fisheries management.

That same summer I also experienced the wild trout fishery on the Naknek River in June, boiling smolt being chased by 10-pound, dime-bright rainbows. Combine those days with the memory of watching 2 million sockeye push into the mouth of the Kvichak River on one flood tide in mid-July, and that summer can be described as nothing short of magnificent.

There were other major changes brewing for Bristol Bay in 1979 that would alter the landscape forever. Recreational activity and guided tourism was growing in leaps and bounds. In 1980, Katmai National Park and Preserve was created with the passage of the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act. The following vears would continue to see unprecedented growth. Between 1982 and 1990 visits to the Brooks River/Katmai Camp associated with an outfitter/operator would grow from 243 visits to over 7,000. In 1982 there were three active outfitter/operators in the Alagnak drainage, a tributary to the mighty Kvichak River that accounted for 88 client trips. By 1990 there were 32 outfitter/operators and a total of 3,769 client trips. Bristol Bay had officially been discovered.

simple: Strict, science-based fisheriesmanagement policy. That and the ability to react and modify

those policies and associated regulations as human impact and biological conditions change is the cornerstone of an effective management regime. Sure, the harvest of 37 million sockeye is staggering, but at the same time 21 million sockeye made their way past the commercial fishery to the spawning grounds. Yes, close to 40,000 anglers in Bristol Bay in one summer is astounding. But, trophyonly designations, catch-and-release requirements, equipment regulations and bag limits by species and area have combined to ensure a world-class Bristol Bay angling experience.

Don't get me wrong, management and women now depend on.

Simply put, it's all part of the plan, so don't forget to give thanks to the stakeholders who worked together to create these policies and to the State of Alaska for the decades of dedication and investment in the sustainable resources and associated management systems that support the recreational, commercial and subsistence fisheries in Bristol Bay. These two essential items, intact habitat and management with an eye toward the future, work together to ensure Bristol Bay remains as it is today.

The Future

This is where things get a little fuzzy. We know what Bristol Bay looked like 40 years ago and we know what happened over the past four decades to create the physical, biological and political landscape

Over 1,800 drift gillnet permits and better than 1,000 set gillnet permits fish commercially for sockeye salmon every summer. In the summer of 2017 the commercial fishery harvested 37 million fish in Bristol Bay waters, and 1- to 2 million sockeye bound for Bristol Bay were harvested in intercept fisheries on the Alaska Peninsula. Yet the Bristol Bay watershed, its estuaries and nearshore waters, are home to arguably the most pristine, productive and healthy coldwater fishery habitat in the world. How can this be? The numbers are huge both in terms of commercial harvest and recreational use. The answer is quite

decisions, regulations and policies have at times been extremely contentious and sometimes hard to swallow. We should be thankful to our predecessors for investing the energy, time and expertise those choices have had clear benefits on the longevity and resiliency of the wild salmon all types of Bristol Bay fishermen

we have today. What transpires from this day forward is much less clear.

Collectively, we are the "user groups," the fly fishermen, the rafters, the commercial guys, the subsistence fishermen. In our minds, the wild salmon, the rivers brimming with cold, clean, clear water, it belongs to us. Public land and resources are a benefit of being a U.S. citizen; it's an entitlement if you will.

I would contend that we can no longer take these things for granted. As I pointed out earlier, we have nurtured these resources for decades with sound management and by working together. Simply put, that's not enough anymore. The onus of making sure these places, these wild salmon and trout, the Bristol Bay watershed, stay vibrant for generations to come—that responsibility now falls squarely on our shoulders.

There are issues in the wind: Pebble Mine, the proposed EPA repeal of the "Waters of the United States" provision of the Clean Water Act that currently protects headwater streams and wetlands in watersheds, the current administration's repeal of the requirement for mining companies to show financial capacity to clean up pollution caused by operations, and for Alaska residents, the upcoming "Yes for Salmon" ballot initiative that would protect critical habitat adjacent to development projects.

Ultimately, the message is Don't take anything for granted anymore. We need to educate each other and be unrelenting advocates for what we believe is right for ourselves, our families and the places we love. Rely on the professionals, search for scientific review of these issues, learn more by following publications from Alaska Region Trout Unlimited, the Save Bristol Bay campaign, Alaska Marine Conservation Council, Trustees for Alaska, Nature Conservancy for Alaska and many more—and keep tight lines and explore new rivers, of course. But from this day forward, always watch your back and assume the responsibility of advocating for the privilege to call yourself a fisherman.

Salmon Sense

Gizmos & Gadgets to Make Life on the Water Better

On cold, dark winter days I'll admit that I often get sucked down the rabbit hole that is the internet. Of course, that often ends in me ordering something that I, until that day, didn't know existed but suddenly absolutely had to have.

Over the years, I've ordered my share of gizmos and gadgets that ended up getting used once and forgotten. There are, however, others that have proven to be very useful. Here are some of my recent favorites to make your fishing day better and easier.

Keep the Tangles Down

If there's one thing that drives me crazy, it is having a bunch of rigged rods in a boat (or in the truck on the way home) that get all tangled up with one another. It boggles my mind how quickly a few rods stowed together can turn into a 10-minute detangling session.

Well, I have found the answer to that and it's to keep all your rods sleeved in a rod sock. Not the old-school soft kind, either. I'm talking about the modern mesh its normal size, so you can stuff 3 or 4 bobber fishing, all my plug rods will be ones that are made out of the same material



used to make the old kid's toys called Chinese fingercuffs.

These rod covers—again, made by a whole host of manufacturers—are actually

diameter). It also adjusts and expands to irregular shapes, so it will fit over rod eyes.

In my boat in Alaska, which doesn't have very large rod trays, I'll keep my techniquemade of expandable braided sleeving. The specific rods together in sleeves when not material expands to about three times using them. For example, when we are rods into one (depending on the sleeve in their sleeves waiting for action. It only

takes a couple seconds to unsheathe one set and cover the other and that small effort will keep things from getting ugly.

Get the Gunk Off

One of my great discoveries this past season was orange hand soap. You know the kind that you'll often see at construction job sites or auto parts stores? I know...it doesn't sound exciting, but that stuff is amazing! It is about the only thing I have found that will actually get the stink off your hands stuff like roe, herring, fish guts, etc.

In addition, it's great for getting driedup egg goo off your rods. Simply put some on a damp sponge and scrub away. I also keep a bottle of orange soap in my boat—it works amazingly well on dried fish blood, slime and roe splatters.

There are several different brands and they all seem to work fine-Zep, GoJo and Permatex to name a few. I like the ones with pumice in them for washing my hands but go with the non-gritty kind for

Let There be Light!

Okay, I'll admit that I'm a bit of a light junky now that everything has gone LED. There are just so many cool options out there for mounting in your shop and on your boat or truck. Well, the one that I use all the time is the HDX Rechargeable Thin Light from Home Depot (about \$17).

It's a 250-lumen LED light stick that has a foldable hanger hook and integrated magnet, which means you can stick it anywhere. When backing my boat into the side yard at night, I'll attach it to the back of my trailer, so I can see where I'm going. I also use it at home for tying leaders—as I get older, I need all the light I can get! The light is also great in the boat in the early morning, and of course, I use it all around the house, too.

Fire Without Fuel

Another gizmo that I really like having with me on fishing trips is a USB no-fuel lighter. I first stumbled onto them on Amazon last year and was very surprised to learn that there are rechargeable lighters now!

Rather than a flame, these cool little contraptions use a plasma electric arc. That makes them windproof and you also have the benefit of not having to worry about refilling it all the time. The one I bought has dual arcs, which makes it more powerful; it will light at least 100 times before I have to recharge for a couple hours on the USB cable.

A lighter is always nice to have when you are out fishing in the sticks so you can light an emergency fire (or signal flame), cook food, etc. If you look online, you can find all sorts of USB lighters under \$20.

A Chair...Anywhere!

When camping or heading out on long fishing hikes, I'll often add one convenience item to my gear and that's a packable chair. Most weigh only 1.5- to 2 pounds and fold into a carry sack that will easily fit into a day pack. Pop out the aluminum legs and stick them together like tent poles, stretch the seat material across the ends and you have an amazingly comfortable chair wherever you happen to be.


You should see the looks I have gotten

were stopping for lunch. After hiking around in waders all day, having a nicer place to sit is awesome!

You can spend anywhere from under \$20 to over \$100 depending on where you buy your chair—and where it is made. This is a case where spending a little more on a good one is usually worth it in the long run.

What's on our Desk

Our typical approach to this column is to tie a fly that goes along with the general theme of each issue. With this month's issue being the annual gear review, I figured we would talk about some of the tools we use each day and why we use them, hopefully giving you a little insight into the everyday tying habits of the shop.

In today's fly-tying world, materials and equipment are changing and advancing constantly. You see all kinds of ads telling you about how great this is and how great that is, but you must sit back and wonder, is it? To answer that, yes and no; like all things, there are cool new items that are great and some that just are not as cool as they sound. In this article, we are going to show you what we like and what makes tying flies easier and more enjoyable.

A lifelong Alaskan with a passion for family, flyfishing and fly-tying, Mike Brown is the owner of Mossy's Fly Shop in Anchorage, AK.

- 1. Bobbins: There are a ton of bobbins on the market today, and choosing a bobbin can be budget-oriented or just personal preference (easy to thread, spool tension adjustment, ceramic or not, and the list goes on). For us it's mainly about having multiple bobbins to speed up time. We like to have one set with thread, and one set with flat braid (this helps not waste an expensive material). Having the ability to just switch material being used quickly and efficiently makes things move smoother.
- 2. Bodkin: Since we do a lot of composite loops and just dubbing loops in general, a bodkin is a big piece of picking out the material and is a must on the bench.
- 3. Brushes: We keep a variety of brushes on the bench. While stiff brushes can be hard to come by, we use them to brush out materials in dubbing loops and to brush out heads or bodies after we wrap them.
- **4.** Combs: We use a lot of rabbit and fox, and combs make for getting the under-fur out easy, allowing us to get a smaller and more manageable diameter for wrapping, reducing bulk and wet-fly weight. Combs are great with deer hair as well as craft fur (you'd be surprised how much under-fur is in
- **5.** Composite Loop Ruler: This ruler, designed by Jerry French, is a must for the composite loop tyer. Measuring out your material and































knowing exactly how many wraps you will get is essential to a good composite loop fly.

- **6. Cutters:** We tie a lot of articulated and stinger-style flies, so we cut a lot of steel. A good pair of wire cutters is a must to get a good, clean finish to your fly. Just like mono tags are a no-go, so are metal shank tags.
- 7. Dubbing Twister: Since we use dubbing loops in just about every fly we tie, a good dubbing twister is a valuable tool on the desk.
- **8. Hackle Plier:** Hackle pliers are a versatile tool for us. We have all popped a dubbing loop off before and groaned. Well, grab your hackle pliers and save that loop. It's also a handy tool to grab a strip of rabbit as well, or anything you are wrapping for that matter.




- 10. Material Holder: What we are showing here are the small gear holders from Nite lze: these little bendable ties are great for holding down anything you need to hold back and out of the way until you are in need of it. Small hair clips are a great option for this as well.
- 11. Rubber Band: I keep rubber bands on my vise to hold a rear hook back and out of the way on articulated-style flies. Keeping that hook held back tight helps keep a hook-point out of your finger.
- 12. Scissors: We use up to four scissors during the process of tying a fly: a good, sharp pair for thread and materials only, a braid scissor for cutting articulation/stinger braid, a junk pair for wire and lead, and occasionally a thinning scissor to make tapered tails on sculpin-type patterns.
- 13. Shank Adapter: We tie-on a lot of shanks or cut hooks for articulated-style

patterns, and most vises don't hold a hook-shank very well at all. The HMH Tube Fly Adapter was the first tool we used to hold a shank and it worked great, then OPST came out with their shank adapter, which allowed for better maneuverability around the back end of the pattern. Since we tie on Regals, we approached Regal about adding a groove to the jaw to hold shanks. This has proven to be a great option, not requiring extra parts to float around on the desk and get lost.

14. UV: UV resins have replaced head cement for us. The ability to apply a small amount and hit it with the light and you are done in seconds has proven its worth time and time again. One thing we have learned in the UV resin craze is that you need to buy a good light the first time. There are a lot of light options on the market, but what we have found is that the cheaper lights burn up batteries and wear out fast.

15. Wax: Wax is an important item when using dubbing loops, as keeping material in place and not letting it get dumped on the table makes for a lot less frustration. We really like the Overton's wax because it's less static.

Outboards

It's my hypothesis that the evolution of the outboard motor has changed so dramatically over recent years that the newest generation outboards offer more performance and efficiency than ever before, and now provide power options that were once only available with conventional power and drive systems. Today's outboard configurations include single, twin, triple and even quad power, delivering up to 1,600 galloping ponies at the boat's transom.

There are a number of manufacturers building excellent motors, and there's little doubt they have all pushed the envelope to create the outboards we enjoy today. Here are the industry's leading lights.

Evinrude

Certainly the oldest and most historical name of all the outboard manufacturers, Evinrude's initial outboard efforts evolved over romance and ice cream. As the story goes, Ole Evinrude and his lady of interest, Bessie (his future wife), were picnicking off Okauchee Lake when she thought ice cream sounded good. In the time it took for Ole to row feverishly to the shore he had decided

there must be a more efficient way to propel a small craft, thus inspiring the portable

Evinrude's first outboards were onecylinder and 1.5HP, and an instant success. Through a series of mergers and acquisitions, Evinrude eventually joined with the Lockwood Motor Company, then with Johnson Motor Company, becoming Outboard Marine Corporation (OMC). After many years pioneering the outboard industry, OMC declared bankruptcy and its assets were acquired by Bombardier Recreational Products (BMP), which continues to build Evinrude-brand outboard motors.

Technology and engineering is where Evinrude has made its biggest impacts, and the company is still carving the water with its two-stroke platform.

E-TEC is Evinrude's state-of-the-art technology that provides improved fuel efficiency, reduced emissions and oil usage, lower noise levels and decreased maintenance needs. This is due in part to a pinpoint oiling system that only applies oil to the necessary components, unlike the original two-stroke motors. Evinrude E-TEC was the first outboard engine technology to win the American Environmental Protection Agency 2004 Clean Air Excellence Award, which recognizes low emission levels.

The E-TEC G-2 is Evinrude's flagship

outboard and it provides more torque than its four-stroke counterparts because every stroke is a power stroke. When pitted against comparable outboards, Evinrude's G2 technology offers 20% more torque, 15% better fuel efficiency and 75% fewer emissions, according to Evinrude's comparison tests.

The Evinrude ETEC is available from 15HP to 150HP and the ETEC G-2 is available from 150- to 300HP. Evinrude also has outboards for pontoons, jet units and a portable line to cover all boating applications. To give owners added security, BRP Evinrude offers an industry-leading, ten-year, factory-backed extended service coverage on all Evinrude E-TEC and Evinrude E-TEC G2 engines, the longest in the industry.

Mercury

Mercury Marine entered the outboard market in 1939 and quickly found success with their Lightning 10HP, which offered the best power-to-weight-to-dollar value available. The two-stroke in-line six Tower of Power and the industry's first V-6 175HP Black Max solidified its position as a performance propulsion system, both within the racing communities as well as with diehard anglers.

Electronic Fuel Injection became gamechanging technology for Mercury in

1987, improving two-stroke performance up to 220HP. Keeping up with emission requirements pushed for even more efficiency, which brought about the debut of the OptiMax, utilizing Direct-Fuel-Injection (DFI), an air-assist injection system. Mercury also entered the four-stroke outboard world with a splash, introducing the supercharged Verado in 2004, which has earned ratings up to 400HP under superior torque and acceleration across the the Mercury Racing Division. The Verado offers power and torque comparable to its two-stroke brethren.

Today the Mercury lineup includes their **Honda** Optimax and Pro XS, the FourStroke, the Verado, the Jet and their commercial-grade SeaPro FourStroke.

The Optimax and Pro XS are similar creatures, other than the XS is supertuned for performance, offering a more throaty response and a quicker hole shot. Available from 115HP to 250 HP, the two-stroke Optimax family features twostage direct injection that translates into great performance and fuel efficiency in the BF225. while meeting the most stringent emission standards.

The Mercury FourStroke is filled with boater-driven innovations and is available from 2.5HP up to 150HP. Electronic fuel injection, on-board digital monitoring and super corrosion-protection gives the FourStroke no-worry reliability with

outstanding performance. Still, nothing compares to the quiet, effortless operation of Verado, which is available from 175HP to 350HP. The SmartCraft Digital Throttle and Shift (DTS) provides ultra-smooth shifting and instantaneous throttle response all while the electro-hydraulic, automotivestyle power steering provides precision handling. The supercharged Verado creates entire performance range, while running smooth and quiet, with great fuel efficiency.

When Honda released its first outboard in 1964 they were already a leader in the motorcycle industry, and the company began by building smaller outboards, including the GB25, GB30 and GB 40. It wasn't until 1998 before Honda tipped the 100HP mark with their 130HPrated EFI outboard. By 2001 Honda rolled out the industry's first Variable Valve Timing and Electrical Lift Control (VTEC)

Honda keeps pushing the technological curve, releasing Boosted Low Speed Torque (BLAST) technologies for low-end performance, Lean Burn Control for more efficient operations and Three-Way Cooling designed to best manage heat and heat flow for maximum performance.



configuration. This series includes all of Honda's trademark technologies, including VTEC and BLAST, and it also introduces Intelligent Shift and Throttle (iST). The iST allows for up to 4 engines and 2 control stations and provides for effortless control and fine-tuning of throttle settings at any speed. Added benefits include enhanced docking, slow speed control and a simple and easy to understand user interface.

Suzuki

Manufacturing both motorcycles and automobiles, Suzuki developed both two- and four-stroke engines, earning high marks in both markets, and then in 1965, the Suzuki 5.5HP D55 two-stroke outboard entered the marine marketplace. By 1980 Suzuki was already developing industry firsts, including the first automatic oil injection system in their popular DT85. By 1985 the company introduced their V6 DT150 and DT200, earning the "Most Innovative Products" award from NMMA. In 1997 and 1998 Suzuki was doubly recognized, receiving the coveted Innovation Award at the International Marine Trade Exhibit and Conference for their DF60 and DF70 four-strokes.

Meeting the demand for more power and better emissions, in 2005 Suzuki released its 250HP V-6 four-stroke, which was touted as the lightest four-stroke outboard with the highest displacement in its class. Today, the 350HP DF350A tops the charts, featuring Contra Rotating Propellers and Multi Point Sequential Electronic Fuel Dual Injection with Lean Burn and Oxygen Sensor.

The Suzuki DF2.5 portable outboard is the smallest Suzuki four-stroke to date. Weighing just 30 pounds, the DF2.5 is the lightest Suzuki four-stroke motor ever built. The High-Thrust 9.9 horsepower fourstroke has been specially designed for anglers and is considered the ultimate trolling motor. The new battery-less EFI powerhead puts fuel injection in a small outboard and the integrated power tilt makes raising and lowering Suzuki's DF9.9TH High Thrust a breeze, which hits paydirt when backtrolling into those fishy tailouts.

The Suzuki midsize series spans the 40- to 60HP range in a three-cylinder configuration. The DF40A is the only engine in its class to offer Dual Overhead Cam (DOHC) performance and also incorporate a maintenance-free, oil-bathed timing chain, which provides the outboard with increased durability and maintenancefree operation. Jumping up to the DF60AV, technologies include the "High Energy Rotation" lower unit sporting a 2.42:1 gear ratio, which enables the use of a bigger 14-inch prop. It also incorporates the Lean Burn Fuel Control System, which adjusts the air/fuel mixture according to

operating conditions.

The In-Line 4 series is Suzuki's triedand-true four-cylinder outboard for 70HP to 200HP. The DF175AP and DF150AP are designed on an in-line four-cylinder DOHC powerhead with 175-cubic-inch displacement, the largest to date in the four-stroke, four-cylinder DOHC category. While the large displacement delivers both exceptional acceleration and speed, Suzuki engineers have made sure that the outboard's final dimensions are as compact and lightweight as possible.

Double Overhead Camshaft 24-valve powerheads and electronic fuel injection are featured across the Suzuki V6 lineup. While the DF300AP, DF250AP and DF250 feature Variable Valve Timing for increased low- to mid-range torque, the DF250 and DF225 take advantage of a multi-stage induction system to gain maximum top-end performance. Using a 55-degree V-block design, Suzuki engineers have managed to pack the power and performance into an incredibly compact design.

Yamaha

Yamaha launched their first U.S. outboard line in 1983, featuring two-stroke models from 40HP to 220HP that showcased Precision Blend Oil Injection. Seeing the writing on the wall, Yamaha was quick to transition into the four-stroke arena,

High Pressure Direct Injection (HPDI). In 2002 Yamaha introduced the F225A, the highest horsepower rating of any four-stroke outboard. Two years later the V6 F250 with Variable Camshaft Timing emerged, and in 2007 Yamaha surpassed the 300HP mark with the behemoth V8 F350. Yamaha continues to design and develop some of the most reliable outboards on the market and has a full platform of power options for today's boater and angler.

Yamaha's portable line of outboards provide power options from 2.5HP to 25HP, with all the reliability and engineering Yamaha is known for. The newly redesigned F25 has gone through a transformation, making it the lightest 25HP outboard on the water—two-stroke or four-stroke.

For family and watersports, fishing and recreating, Yamaha has developed its midrange lineup, with outboards from 30HP to 115HP. The Yamaha 115HP and the all-new 90HP and 75HP four-strokes are reliable inshore performers. Fast and powerful, they sport 1.8-liter displacement and DOHC or SOHC designs with four valves per cylinder. This gives them exceptional efficiency and lighter weights; again, with unmatched reliability.



launching its 100HP outboard featuring 115HP, 150HP and 175HP in-line fourcylinder, as well as V6 200HP, 225HP and 250HP models proclaiming a 13% faster hole shot. The new VF90 In-Line Four V MAX SHO is a single-overhead-camshaft design with four valves per cylinder and 1.8-liter displacement that is super-tuned for great low-end torque and exceptional high-speed performance. It is also the quietest motor in its class, making for some pretty stealthy fishing.

Bagging the Right Net

There's a lot more to consider when picking out a landing net than landing another salmon to bonk for the table.

Some considerations are pretty basic, such as selecting a net with an extra-long handle if you typically troll multiple downriggers and net fish on the fly without popping and retrieving the other working rods. Downrigger trollers need a net with a handle long enough to extend beyond downrigger arms, streaming wire cables, over the outboard housing, past the prop to bag a salmon that's tethered eight feet beyond the barrel swivel that you knotted in to reduce line twist.

When you dig in with your toes and stretch across the gunwale extending 10 feet of handle, rim and bag as far as you can reach to derrick 20 pounds of salmon over the boat gear—that's the moment you'll wish you'd sprung for the more expensive net, the one with the really stout handle. The farther out you reach, the stouter the handle needs to be. One of the quickest experiences that I know of that will transform grinning fun into oh fud is to have a lightweight net handle fold up when it's asked to derrick a solid chunk of salmon.

with a shallow bag—not one of those deep sweepers cavernous enough to retrieve passing deer.

Deep bags have their uses, but they also tend to tangle anything that's not smooth and recessed, including salmon fins, lures, terminal tackle, boat cleats, misplaced pliers, boat boots, rod holders and downriggers. When extended and reaching for a finished salmon while on the troll, the big bags tend to drift out below the rim toward and under the targeted fish. When this happens more things can go wrong than right. The problem is exacerbated with longer handles.

With standard shorter-handled nets it's easy to grab the bottom of the big bag and pinch it against the handle out of the way until it's time to release around the fish and that's AFTER the fish slides over the rim. Not so easy 10 feet away from the boat.

Here's something else to consider.

Everything that's netted doesn't, or shouldn't, die.

Netting a bonker for the table is one thing, but netting a semi-tough fish

When you've accomplished all the hard work and brought your prize salmon to the boat, you want to make sure the last task goes smoothly; having a net not up to the job can often send your fish right

that's going to be released is entirely another. It's something we need to face as ADF&G regulations move ever forward on restricting what's legal to keep and what means a ticket, as well as the growing catchand-release ethic.

A multi-year study at Carleton University in Ontario found—flat out—that anadromous salmonids had the highest survival rates when landed with rubber-mesh bags with largediameter mesh.

The study concluded that rubber bags were the best option after comparing fin fraying, scale loss and mucous loss of trout landed with four different bag types, plus bare, wet hands.

Test anglers fished with spinning rods and barbed treble- and single hooks from boats, conditions that replicate a lot of our salmon fishing.

When salmonids were held in the water while hooks were removed, the rubber nets with large mesh significantly improved the condition of releases in catch-and-release fisheries.

Small mesh, not made of rubber, consistently inflicted wounds, mucous loss or fin damage during handling and release, according to the study authors. The study compared rubber mesh bags with bags made of nylon, polypropylene or rubber-coated along with bare-hand landings.

Nets tested included 1-inch knotless rubber mesh, micro-mesh about 0.1 of an inch, knotless nylon micromesh, polypropylene with 1.57-inch knotted mesh and a small knotless coated nylon mesh with 0.23-inch mesh.

Study results found that the polypropylene mesh resulted in the greatest fin fraying, and the most scale loss was from bare, wet hands, nylon mesh and coated nylon mesh.


Knotless nylon mesh had the highest frequency of scale loss and frequently caused mucous loss.


A side finding was that test salmonids caught with treble hooks did not have significantly higher mortality rates compared with salmonids caught on single hooks, but the increase in handling time and air exposure to untangle trebles and fish from net mesh produced increases in mortality.

Long stout handles, shallow bags, large rubber mesh and a rail-mounted net holder—that's what you're looking for at the boat and outdoor shows when gearing up for next salmon season.

Fishing the Balanced Leech Story & photos by George Krumm

Though I have always liked the sight of a bobber going down, somehow it seems slightly distasteful from a fly-fishing perspective. "Using a bobber is for kids," my dad would say. "We fly fish, with dry flies."

That was in Montana many years ago, but times have certainly changed for me. I actually prefer fishing lakes to fishing streams most of the time. If using a bobber is distasteful, what about all that time I've spent not only using a bobber, but also using something that is arguably not a fly—but a bead? I guess it's great we have lots of room for interpretation on what is fly fishing. One inarguable truth is that a fly pattern suspended below a bobber (Strike indicator? Take signaler? Trout detector? Bite beacon?) is very effective if there is enough wave action to animate the fly.

The balanced leech can be fished under a bobber or by itself. However, I only fish it under a bobber. If I want to strip it, I'll use a less heavily-weighted Bugger-type pattern. Balanced leeches have worked every place I've tried them. I tend to use them most on very windy days—days in which other presentations are difficult to execute. For all intents and purposes, what follows is based on my experience of using balanced leeches under a bobber, or indicator.

Advantages

- Once you cast it out, it's always fishing.
- It is balanced, so when suspended below a bobber it is horizontally oriented, like an actual leech.
- On days when it's too windy for typical cast-and-retrieve presentations, the balanced leech under a bobber works great and might be the only feasible solution.
- Great method for beginning fly fishers and kids as it doesn't require frequent

- If fished without an indicator, the balanced leech rides hook-point up, making it less likely to snag wood or rocks.
- Hooked fish are rarely hooked deep and are almost always hooked in the upper jaw rather than the tongue or lower jaw.

Disadvantages

• Balanced leeches are not readily available

in fly shops—yet. However, for anglers in Anchorage, Mossy's Fly Shop does carry a good selection.

• When fished under an indicator, they do not work well on flat, calm days as there is no chop to make them pulsate and breathe.

Most of the time, I use a 6-weight outfit for fishing balanced leeches under an indicator.

My North Fork Composites F 906-4M (Classic) is the rod I usually use when fishing bobber/balanced leech setups. I use a Rio Gold WF-6-F floating fly line most of the time if I'm fishing from a boat or tube. If I'm shore fishing, I like the appropriate size Rio Switch Chucker line. For a leader, you can use a tapered mono leader with a fluorocarbon tippet, but to be honest, you don't need a commercially-sold, tapered leader for fishing a balanced leech under a bobber. I sometimes use a straight piece of 8- or 10-pound-test fluorocarbon such as Seaguar's STS Fluorocarbon, to which I add a couple feet of 3x MAX Fluorocarbon tippet or Rio Fluoroflex Plus Tippet. I use a non-slip mono loop knot to tie on the fly.

On the kind of days on which this technique works best, I generally try to find some structure (weed line, drop off, shoreline, etc.) at which the wind is blowing. I then position myself upwind of that structure and either hold myself with my fins, or anchor. I then cast the rig to the structure and wait. I think you know what to do when the bobber goes down.

Fishing with indicators on windy days, whether with a chironomid pupa imitation or a balanced leech, is deadly in all lakes where trout swim. At times when the wind is making any normal presentation really difficult, the balanced leech and indicator can save the day. I've used balanced leeches from southcentral Alaska down to the Lower 48 to southern Argentina. I've landed little stocked rainbows, big stocked rainbows and naturally produced rainbows up to 19 pounds on them. No doubt, they are effective.

This is an extremely versatile rod for heavy-lead trolling, king salmon back-trolling and downrigger fishing. Though rated for up to 12 ounces of lead, our tester used it with up to 16 ounces when trolling with a flasher and herring rig, as well as with flasher and Super Bait combos. The rod also has plenty of backbone for back-trolling magnum divers with bait or plugs in the Kenai or other Chinook rivers. Carbon-fiber grips stand up well for a rod that spends much of its time in a rod holder. Since the construction is a fiberglass/ graphite composite, it's very durable. Our tester commented that if he had to pick just one rod for Chinook trolling or back-trolling, this would be it. It is handmade in the USA, too.

Quantum Nova Coldwater Series Rods

Salmon and steelhead fans—of which we have more than a few here at Fish Alaska—are going to take special interest in the Nova series. There's a length and action for virtually any cold-water technique, and we found the rods to perform great across a range of species and angling conditions this past year using the 9-foot, 2-piece, medium- light power spinning rod. The rod's features include IM8 graphite construction, cork rod handles and aluminum-oxide guides.

Fenwick Aetos Rod 968-4

The Fenwick Aetos family of rods includes spinning, casting, fly and ice spinning rods. Our tester went to work with the 968-4 fly rod this season and found it a light, easy-tocast and sensitive angling tool. Featuring a fast-action blank, large-diameter gunsmoke stripper guides and double-foot gunsmoke snake guides, this fast-recovering, highperformance rod makes an excellent choice for pursuing big trout, sockeye and silvers in freshwater, or silvers in the salt.

This rod is light, fast and responsive and we found it well suited to catching pinks and silvers in 2017. It's 7 feet, 6 inches long with medium-power and a fast-action, and the two-piece rod is rated for 6- to 12-pound-test. We punished this rod in the saltwater in 2017 and it took all we could dish out. The medium-heavy, one-piece rod is 6 feet long and rated for 20- to 50-pound-test. 
We tested the 7-foot, 9-inch, 6-weight rod. We liked the feel of this fiberglass rod; it's smooth, soft, has medium-power and is forgiving. We found it well-suited to casting and retrieving Buggers, where the softness of the rod made it easier to stick aggressive trout on the strike. We also used it to subdue average-sized pink salmon still bearing sea lice. Those we caught while swinging streamers and nymphing smaller leech patterns. The rod has some power in the butt end and is also tough enough to handle landing hundreds of salmon, as we did with it on Prince of Wales Island in 2017.

The fast action of the rod allowed anglers to effectively work big jigs and we thought the rod was the right length to impart action and provide leverage with large jigs. The graphite/glass composite rod is paired with quality ALPS guides, a machinedaluminum reel seat, comfortable hypalon sponge rubber grip and it is handsomely finished. There are many rods in this family to fit a wide range of anglers' needs.

Orvis Recon 9-foot 6-weight Flv Rod

www.orvis.com This rod is equally at home slinging big streamers to oversized Kenai trout or dropping size 14 Adams onto a Mat-Su Valley lake. We also used it to subdue prowling rainbows that slammed our suspended chironomid pattern as well as pink salmon fresh from the salt. The rod is fast but with enough mid-flex to create some forgiveness during aggressive strikes and gravity-defying leaps. The shadow green blank nicely compliments the black nickel reel seat and dark burlwood inset.

We tested the CARJGII3080C66 and were impressed. It's light but very powerful, which makes it easier to fish heavy jigs to halibut and lingcod and not tire as quickly. These jigging rods are designed to be fished with braid, which is the line of choice when fishing several hundred feet below the surface. Rods feature Fuji K guides with Alconite inserts, Fuji reel seat, and SLS3 blank construction. This rod is 6 feet, 6 inches in length and rated for 30- to 80-poundtest line; there are several options in this family of rods.

If you're familiar with the TFO Deer Creek series of two-handed rods, you're already aware of the remarkable quality and bang for the buck you get with the lineup. The BVK Spey rods are similar, but a little bit faster and a little bit stiffer. The idea was to produce rods that would handle long-line methods and touch-and-go casting better than the slower Deer Creek series. That said, our tester used the 13-foot, 7-weight to target large rainbows on the Naknek with a Skagit line, T-11 and T-14 tips, and big bunny leeches and Intruders. It performed admirably with both an OPST Commando 425-grain head and an Airflo Skagit Switch 510-grain head. Fish up to 31 1/2 inches were landed with this rod. Fit and finish is superb; better than one might expect from a Spey rod in the midrange of prices.

Our testers reported that this reel is tough and sturdy, made to handle the stress of fighting 20-plus-pound salmon. Line lays smoothly on the reel during pickup and the reel is well-balanced. The 5500 has a capacity of 380 yards pound braid, a whopping 40 pounds of max drag and a gear ratio of 5.6:1.

It's hard to beat the excitement of fighting large fish on a single-action reel. The fun factor is off the charts! Islander's TR3 was designed for Canadian-style mooching rods used in trolling applications. Since this reel is made for trolling, there is no free-spool on this reel. The reel spool and frame are machined out of 6061-T6 aluminum and the spindle is 316



stainless steel. The drag material is an ultra-high performance fluoropolymer material with a very low coefficient of friction, extreme durability and consistent performance in a variety of conditions. These drag washers are stacked between layers of stainless steel. The entire drag system is fully sealed, preventing corrosion or debris from damaging it, and it is virtually maintenance-free. Bearings are ceramic, so they don't corrode either. The large drag knob s easily adjustable over a wide range. The 4.6-inch

spool provides really fast line pickup to catch up to fast-running fish. The TR3 will hold 350 yards of 30-pound-test monofilament. As with all Islander reels, the machined, anodized construction and corrosion-resistant components result in a beautiful, tough reel that will last a lifetime, and then some

Its got adequate line pick up for mid-sized Alaskan fish at about 27 inches per handle turn. There are a range of advanced technologies at play in this reel to make it light, strong, durable and corrosion resistant.



The thin wire penetrated very efficiently without much pressure and the hooks held up to thrashing coho without bending. A bunch of colors and sizes are available.

Want to produce an even larger attraction radius than ordinary flashers can provide, especially in low-light conditions? The ProFlash Lighted Flashers do just that. They feature a wateractivated, red, white and green blinking light that enhances flash and visibility. The sealed battery lasts for 80 hours or more and the light can easily be replaced when the battery dies. ProFlash flashers are available in the ProChip 11 series, the ProChip 8 series, and the ProFin 6 series. Our tester used the ProChip 11 Lighted version and it definitely out-produced standard ProChip 11 flashers in lowlight conditions.

This jig was effective in helping our anglers land salmon and bottomfish in the saltwater. It comes in six sizes and eight colors so fishermen can match the jig to the size of bait present. Our

testers used the smaller sizes to land coho and the larger ones to land halibut in the 20- to 50-pound range.











Blue Fox Candyback Vibrax Spinners www.bluefox.com

These iconic spinners are staples of the Alaska angling scene, and this year's newest addition are their Candyback models. The bell is accented with metallic flakes while the back of the blade is finished in a contrasting color. These lures really put off a flash in the water, in addition to the vibration emitted from the bell. Candyback models are available in six color options and in sizes 3, 4, 5 and 6.



Hot Spot Anchovy Series 11-inch Flashers

We hauled in coho in the saltwater using the Green Moon Jelly Front with full Glow back Anchovy Series flasher in 2017. It was effective with spoons, hootchies and herring. Our tester is impressed with the durability of the finish as well as the quality swivels and snaps.

sides of the lure, making it look more realistic on the underside. We caught salmon on all three UV versions we tested: black, purple and green. This is one of our favorite lures to troll for coho.

We tried the 309SP, which is 9 inches long and is rated at 30-pound-test. These leaders are stainless-steel wire with a nylon coating, with a Sampo ball-bearing swivel on one end and a stainless-steel lock snap at the other. It allowed us to throw both topwater and sub-surface lures and catch pike like the one shown.



We like that these spinners are available with either a single- or treble-hook option.





Tackle

Luhr Jensen Kwikfish Dual Dot Finishes

Luhr Jensen added some new Dual Dot finishes to the extensive lineup of Kwikfish and we caught salmon on the 14X Black/Chartreuse model while testing in 2017. We think these high-contrast finishes help salmon locate the lure when visibility is low. And of course, the irresistible action of the iconic Kwikfish drives salmon to strike. If we plan on back-trolling for salmon, we never leave home without a box of Kwikfish.



Dutch Fork Custom Lures Turtle Shell Blades, size 4 and 5 www.dutchforkcustomlures.com

Dutch Fork spinner blades are made of a high-impact polymer. As such, they are extremely tough, light and perhaps more versatile than metal spinner blades. They spin easily at speeds as low as .4 miles per hour. Our tester used them to build in-line spinners for use behind 360 flashers. He rigged them both on spinner wire and directly on monofilament leader material. The light blade material allowed use of bigger spinner blades—

with 360 flashers a metal blade larger than size 3.5 is too heavy and doesn't produce the desired action. With the Dutch Fork blades, our tester used sizes 4 and 5 blades behind Pro-Troll ProChip 11-inch flashers and caught many Chinook.



Undoubtedly, the lighter blade might be a better choice when fishing spinners on anchor, and also for back-trolling applications. These lighter blades produce different sound and vibration than metal blades, and that could result in more attention from the fish in heavily pressured fisheries. The finish on Dutch Fork blades does not chip or flake off, even after much use and many fish.

Umpqua Insta Set Indicators www.umpqua.com

We used these effectively in stillwater when fishing a suspended chironomid. The indicator rides high in the water, and the red and yellow colors are easy to see. The fluorescent tags below the indicator give even more visual cues when a light strike occurs. We've yet to use them in moving water, but we imagine they will work well. They are light, easy to rig and come in a variety of sizes.



www.mackslure.com We caught some dandy trout and a bunch of pink salmon

on this lure in 2017. We strictly cast and retrieved the lure and will try it soon on the troll. It comes in original, glow and UV models. The action of the lure imitates a wounded baitfish and the ring chamber within the lure emits a fishattracting low-frequency vibration.



Salamander Sinkers Single Loop Sinker

We really enjoyed drift-fishing with these sinkers in 2017. They slide over rocks and limbs in the water better than lead or slinky sinkers, and we experienced less snags because of it. They are available in 1/4-, 3/8- and 1/2-ounce sizes.





We tried both 20- and 50-pound-test Ande Braid this year and could easily see that this generation of braid from Ande is better than past offerings. Tough, quiet, non-stretching and easy to cast, we were impressed when throwing spinners to coho and jigging metal to toothy denizens of the deep.

We tested 50-pound-test in natural color and hauled up a range of bottomfish in 2017. We like that it didn't bind when piled on the reel and that it is strong, doesn't stretch and is supple. We were able to feel bites at 300 feet and bury the hook. This line is available in 12- to 300-pound-test and in many spool sizes.

There have been several spinner clevises designed over the years to allow you to change the blade of a spinner. The Dutch Fork "No Loss" clevis is easy to use, and our tester experienced zero blade loss while landing several kings using this clevis. The "No Loss" clevis comes in a metal version for rigging on spinner wire and a plastic version for rigging on monofilament. Single versions allow for the use of one blade, while the tandem clevis allows for the use of two blades.



Eppinger Dardevle Salmon Kit www.eppinger.net

This kit is a great place to start if you are a conventional tackle angler looking to target chum, pink, coho and Chinook salmon in Alaska. The colors, models and sizes chosen offer the angler a wide range of presentations in a variety of water and light conditions. Anglers can customize the color selection as long as they stay with the same model of spoon in the kit. We used this kit to catch pinks and silvers in 2017 in several different rivers. They also worked to attract rainbow trout and Dolly Varden in the Iliamna area.



We downtrolled the 045 size spinner in 2017 and chromer Chinook slammed it with a vengeance. The blade has a pass-through hole for water, which allows the blade to spin at slower speeds and creates more vibration. We like the Nickel Chartreuse Green Dot model, but there are many colors available. There is also a longer, heavier 006 size lure if you are fishing heavier flows.

Candy Bar Lures

The Candy Bar lure is a truly effective weapon for catching halibut. Our tester reported that the 7-ounce chrome model with treble hook, used with bait or without, produced great fish on all of their trips. On one trip in particular they put five halibut in the boat with the lure, the largest being 118 pounds, the others in the 40- to 80-pound range. On another trip to the same area, the Candy Bar out-fished the other halibut lures being used and produced all the halibut caught that day.

Stealthy. Strong. Superb abrasion-resistance for toothy critters such as pike. Seaguar ABRAZX 100% Fluorocarbon Musky & Pike Leader comes in 25-yard coils and is a great alternative to steel leaders. Thick fluorocarbon is easier on fish that you plan to release. It is available in tests from 80to 130 pounds, and although not marketed for saltwater species, the 130-pound-test version can

be used for lingcod and halibut rigs. We used the 80-pound on northern pike on the Innoko River and it worked very well.

Rio InTouch Switch Chucker #6 (420 grains)

The Switch Chucker is an interesting line design that is capable of several different fishing styles. This integrated line is aimed at switch rods, and versatility is the name of the game with the Switch Chucker. With it, one can easily fish indicators and beads in the morning, then switch to a poly leader or light T-tip for Skagit-casting sculpins later in the day. It is a short, powerful taper with an integrated running line, so an angler can also strip flies back to the rod tip when targeting silvers in the soft water in which they sometimes hold. It's an easy-casting line, and performs very well in the wind.

Olympic Peninsula Skagit Tactics Commando Tips

Not that long ago, level sections of T-material were the only sink-tip material available. OPST refined what was available by making theirs in three different weights (96-, 132- or 168 grains) but with several sink rates in each weight. For instance, in their 132-grain range (which is equivalent in weight to T-11) there is a dual-density S2/3 tip that sinks at roughly 3 inches-per-second; a S5/6 tip that sinks at about six inches-per-second, and a

S8/9 that sinks at roughly 9 inches-per-second. All three of these tips are the same length and weight, which enables the caster to use the same casting stroke regardless of which tip is on the end of their head. OPST designed these tips to be used with their Commando Heads; however, they work well on any Skagit head. Note that they are 12 feet long; this helps eliminate blown anchors for anglers using very short heads.



Seaguar MAX 100% Fluorocarbon Tippet Material

There are lots of good tippet materials on the market today. Seaguar MAX fluorocarbon is a great one. Our tester used 3x and 4x versions in Alaska stillwaters this summer and landed hundreds of fish, with many in the 18- to 24-inch range. He also landed one he estimates at over 30 inches—a fish which tore through a couple different weed beds and seemed sure to break off. The 3x MAX held despite the abrasive nature of the weeds and the unusually large rainbow. MAX ties knots easily and is suppler

than many other fluorocarbon tippet materials. It is available in 30-yard spools, in sizes from 1x to 7x.







Use with bagged ice or better yet, Arctic Ice Tundra Series ice packs, and your catch will stay in prime condition all day. This kill bag is particularly well-made and tough. It's flat on the bottom, so it tends to stay where you put it. Cleanup is simple with some Lemon Joy, a soft scrub brush and water. This may be the most well-made kill bag on the market. WPS kill bags are available in several sizes, and custom sizes to fit in your boat's fish box can be ordered.

Arctic Ice Tundra Series has a very unique freezing point of 5°F and is designed to help maintain a consistent freezer temperature in coolers. While not as cold as dry ice, Tundra Series can be used as a suitable replacement it has been shown to maintain frozen temperatures for days in controlled testing. Due to its low freezing point, Tundra Series can take from 18- to 36 hours to freeze, depending on the temperature of the freezer and number of panels being frozen. To ensure Tundra Series panels are frozen, the freezer should be turned to its lowest setting or at least 0°F. Our tester used these most often in conjunction with ice to keep his herring baits as cold as possible. He said that with an XL Tundra on the bottom of a Fish Fighter Products 20-quart Sportsman cooler, and crushed ice and bait above, the ice and bait would stay in a near frozen state for at least three days. He also used Tundra ice packs in his kill bags with ice to help the ice last much longer, and thus ensure his fish stayed in perfect condition. In a small cooler, it is very possible the Tundra series could make your beer slushy. They are that cold!

Scotty Sea Light with Suction Cup Mount

Our tester typically runs out of battery power in his Samsung Galaxy 7 in 4- to 4½ hours of continuous use. It is wise to connect your phone to a portable power pack for fishing longer days. It is also helpful to take it out of the water when not in use as this will turn it off, saving battery power.





Our tester commented that for almost every trolling and back-trolling situation, the bow-mounted Riptide Ulterra makes his life much easier. When the Riptide Ulterra is used in auto-pilot with a standard kicker motor, precision trolling and back-trolling direction and speeds are easily attainable and are pretty much a hands-free experience.

He used a single, Extra Large Arctic Ice Tundra cooler pack, plus crushed ice, and the bait remained in pristine condition until he quit fishing in the late afternoon.

The Alaska FTC crab trap is a collapsible, affordable, light-in-weight crab trap that works great for red rock and Dungeness crabs. It is larger than Danielson's standard crab trap, measuring 24 inches by 24 inches by 13 inches high. It meets Alaska's crab-trap requirements. Our tester used it for Dungeness crabs and claims the light weight of this trap makes it much easier to pull than more expensive, commercial-style traps. He added that since this trap is



light in weight, it is wise to add additional weight to it if fishing in areas with lots of current. He used two pieces of rebar zip-tied to the bottom of the trap and suggests weighting the doors by wrapping six inches of 3/16-inch pencil lead around the lower part of the doors to help keep the doors shut in current.

This product was a definite favorite and a game-changer for our testers.

This lure is very life-like with exceptional action, and it drives rainbow trout, char, lake trout, northern pike and burbot crazy in Alaska lakes. It can be cast or vertically jigged, perfect for searching out fish through an ice hole or in open water. The wings on the lure open each time it falls through the water column and that causes it to glide. Or you can prevent the wings from opening so you can quickly drop back onto fish, and open them back up with a sharp snap. When you snap the rod upwards a couple feet, it causes the wings to open and close rapidly and it looks like a disoriented baitfish. The opening and closing of the wings also mimic the gill action of a baitfish, as well as create predator-attracting noise. It comes in three sizes and multiple patterns which incorporate UV and Glow. This is one of the more innovative lures we have seen in quite some time.

FISHING & LODGING DONE RIGHT:

Last spring my wife's friend asked me a not-so simple question: "If you could fish anywhere in Alaska, where would you go?"

I was almost paralyzed to answer as the choices are virtually endless; Alaska is not only a large state but it also features more miles of offshore saltwater, glacial-fed rivers and tannin-stained and tundrabanked streams than any other state in the nation.

I asked easy questions to narrow the focus: What kind of fishing—salt or stream, gear or fly? What species—salmon, trout, steelhead or halibut? What time of the year?

Her response was open-ended, "I don't know, I asked Jim [her husband] what he wanted for his birthday, and he said fishing with you in Alaska." With an upcoming September birthday, I suggested one of Alaska's premier destinations: Yakutat.

Yakutat is located along the rugged Gulf Coast between Juneau and Cordova. Guarded by the Gulf of Alaska on the south, nearly impenetrable mountains to the north and breathtaking coastal glaciers to the east and west, Yakutat is about as remote as it is beautiful, and there are no roads leading into or out of town. During mid-August and through September and early October, the coho salmon start to flood the waters of the Gulf of Alaska, Yakutat Bay and the surrounding freshwater tributaries. Better known as silver salmon, these eager-

eating acrobats often offer an unmatched angling experience. In addition, silvers cooperate equally well for those who cast bait, gear or a fly.

The next challenge was to find lodging and a charter and guide service, and all it took was one call; I was able to book our fully-guided adventure with the

Once Jim and I landed in town, we were greeted at the airport by John Cole, the new Chief Operating Officer for Yakutat Lodge. John explained that the lodge opened its doors in the mid 1960s and was most recently operated by Ken Fanning and his family. In 2016 the operation was purchased by longtime guest Don Stamper, whose family has promised to continue with the heritage of the lodge, while making improvements and changes to even better serve today's traveling angler.

Adjacent to the airport is the Yakutat Lodge restaurant and store, and the Yakutat Lodge motel. The airport lodge is utilitarian, simple and comfy with cozy rooms, comfortable beds and warm showers. It is conveniently located across the street from the restaurant, which also serves as the morning meeting place for all river-guide departures. Each room comes with its own fish freezer, because let's face it, you're in Yakutat to fish.


We next traveled to Yakutat Lodge on the Bay. It's now starting to feel like fish camp, with a series of log cabins right off Monti Bay. The authentically Alaskan fishing cabins are equipped with sleeping quarters, private baths, full kitchens, large dining rooms and a

covered porch. Guests also have access to the on-site fire pit and barbeques. The property sits immediately adjacent to the *Happy Hooker* Dock, where all Yakutat Lodge charters depart.

Our next stop was the Big House on the Bay, our point of refuge for the next week.

Built for and designed by the Fannings, this quintessential log cabin served as the Fanning's primary residence for several years before being turned into guest lodging. Built with true Alaska Native influence, the spruce logs were sourced and peeled locally and the 30-foot-tall fireplace was crafted from ocean rocks picked from the local shoreline. More than 70 craftsmen, women and artisans helped create this true one-of-a-kind rustic masterpiece.

Walking into the Big House is breathtaking. Being greeted with a massive gourmet kitchen, it was easy to get awestruck as we entered the supersized sunken living room and gazed out at the panoramic view of Monti and Yakutat bays and the Mt. Saint-Elias Mountain Range, complete with views of Mt. Logan, Mt. St. Elias, Mt. Malaspina, Mt. Cook and Mt. Vancouver, just to name a few. It's one of those 'pinch yourself'

moments, as this isn't a fishing cabin; it's a fishing palace.

A totem pole filled with hand-carved local wildlife takes center stage in the living room while tree-trunks with their roots literally growing out of the floor serve as the newel posts for the peeled log staircase. Custom cabinetry and woodwork is found throughout the home, with artistic accents and custom-stained glass in strategic locations. Every nook-and-cranny of the the Big House has received glorious detail.

Typically serving large groups from 4-to 10 persons, the Big House on the Bay features multiple large and comfortable bedrooms, including an oversized master suite complete with walk-in shower, soaking tub and million-dollar views from every angle. Upstairs is the TV/media room, complete with walk-around balcony, game table and again, that superb Yakutat view!

The Big House on the Bay comes with a private chef, concierge and all the amenities you would expect in a five-star resort. It also serves perfectly for corporate getaways. Because we are a two-person group, we forgo the private chef and use the meal package at the lodge, which includes breakfast, lunch and dinner daily.

Our tour ended, it was time to fish, and we promptly headed out for a half-day charter on the *Madame Hooker*, a Kingfisher Coastal Express built specifically for Yakutat Lodge, and one of three boats in the *Happy Hooker* fleet. We met up with Charter Captain Ralph Piccolo, who has been chartering Yakutat waters for the last 11 years. We headed towards Humpy Creek and trolled spinning herring. Fishing was steady, and in short order our group landed 22 silvers before nightfall.

We returned to the lodge for a steak and seafood dinner and to meet our guide for the



next morning. Jordan Knigge fits the image of a fishing guide, stocky with a lightlybearded face and golden, shoulder-length locks pouring from under his ball cap. He was all smiles and emitted positive energy as we discussed tomorrow's fishing plan. The more we chatted, the more excited we became—the storied Situk River is less than 12 hours away.

The sun had yet to fully rise as we arrived at Nine-Mile Bridge, ground zero for boat launching for all Yakutat Lodge drift boats. There was no competition between guides to low-hole one another; in fact, the opposite was true, as they discussed their plans and coordinated the day's fishery. Planning for rain, the weather gods did not disappoint, spitting an almost continual rain through the 14-mile journey. The only change in weather was the type of rain, whether vertical, horizontal or heavy mist.

Jordan explained that we would bypass much of the upper water, getting down into the meat of the run at about the halfway mark. Shortly after launching we rounded a corner and surprised an adolescent black bear that was standing on its hind legs peering over the brush. As we slowed for a better view, we saw mama bear in the background, taking exception to our presence.

The Situk River is not a large river, averaging 75 feet wide and 3 feet deep as it narrowly winds from Situk Lake for 22 miles

before joining the Johnson and Ahrnklin Slough River and entering the Gulf of Alaska. Tanninstained, the river is littered with logs, log-jams and flowing debris. These obstacles create great fishing opportunities, albeit they're extra challenging when fighting a fish.

In most areas the river's edge is covered in bear grass and thick alders and willows, which create a limb-infested overhang. It's these shadowy waters where silvers love to hang out, and with an effective cast, fishing can be exceptional. Jim proved this hypothesis with his first cast, zipping his #4 Blue Fox spinner

under the low-hanging branches into the dark and deep shoreline and being quickly rewarded with an aggressive head-shake, landing his first of at least a dozen chrome silvers brought to the boat. The limit is two fish per angler, so discretion is judiciously applied as we only kept the best of the best. For us this would be any fresh buck north of 12 pounds, with a few in the 14-pound range.



As Jordan processed our fish, we again made our way to the lodge for dinner and to meet with senior guide and guide manager Aaron Shook to discuss our next day's plans. Aaron told us that based on weather, the next day might be our last available on the salt. It's nice to have the flexibility in our schedules to choose fishing based on weather and opportunity, rather than a pre-selected and rigid schedule. Aaron introduced us to

Captain Matt Pearson. Matt's a soft-spoken yet deliberate gentleman who has chartered for several years in Alaska. Matt told us that he had boated two halibut over 90 pounds earlier that day, and he was hopeful we would have similar luck tomorrow.

The following morning we met up with Captain Matt and his 28-foot Alumaweld, Hooker 3. Matt explained that they were predicting large waves and wind, so with luck we'd catch our halibut and then go after silvers. We were joined in the boat by a family from California, including Grandpa Dave, Mother Molly, and 11-year-old Brady, who told me if Fish Alaska magazine ever needed a kid reporter, he would like to apply for the job!

Unlike the day prior, the skies were blue and littered with soft white clouds. We hit our first location, anchored and dropped four rods rigged with bait, assuring a good scent trail. It didn't take long before Brady hooked up with his first fish. It's always exciting exposing our youth to fishing, especially when they are catching. After an enthusiastic battle the fish neared the boat, and disappointingly, it's a Squalus suckleyi, also known as the Pacific spiny dog fish. They are quite the nuisance-fish, but still make for a great photo opportunity. Let's face it, how many 11-year-olds catch a shark?

After landing several more dog fish we relocated and almost immediately the boat sees action. A few small halibut are landed. On these waters an angler is allowed one fish over 28 inches and one under 28, and once you have your large fish, you're done fishing halibut for the day. Jim then hooked up, and finally line started to peel and a real fight ensued. Jim won the battle and landed a 44-pound halibut. As I feverishly jigged a white curly-tail grub I finally hooked into something solid... definitely a keeper, weighing in at 38 pounds and punching our oversized halibut tags. Next stopsalmon fishing.

Matt's preferred method for fishing silvers is mooching, and it proved deadly effective. Simply place the cut-plug herring on the dual-hook, lower the bait through the water column and retrieve up through the column. Silver fishing was absolutely red-hot as Brady put on a fishing clinic, out-fishing everybody on the boat. We even managed a few nicesized kings, which were fun to catch but were not legal for retention.

With such a beautiful day Jim and I decided to opt out of dining at the lodge and cook dinner at the Big House while enjoying the view. Dinner would include fresh-caught halibut and prawns with a sampling of mussels that we harvested on the shoreline. Add to the dining experience a beverage of choice and it was exceptional beyond comparison.

Waking early, the skies were clear and the sunrise was starting to show its brilliance. We













had some brilliance in store for our day, too.

"The senior man" has little to do with age and more to do with experience, wisdom and knowledge. Guide Aaron Shook is without a doubt Yakutat's senior man. Having guided for the lodge for 16 years, Aaron has rowed more than 34,000 miles down the Situk, a feat that few others could claim. As we wound through the Situk, each corner presented new beauty as the sun filtered through the old growth forest at river's edge. The river was running more clearly than our prior day and the fish were notably more aggressive.

We were the second boat to launch because there was a report of a massive tree that came down the night prior and that had blocked passage, a fairly regular occurrence on the river. Guide Kraig Holdren led the fleet, serving as chainsaw-master to clear a safe passage.

Fly-fishing was the first order of business, as I cast my 7-weight with Dolly Llama patterns into likely-looking backwater. After a few easy catches, I changed-out gear, this time trying a Pen-Tac B.C. Steel tipped with a pink worm. The spoon found deep water quickly, managing an almost 16-pound, kype-jawed jewel. After losing a few fish, Aaron looked at my rod and suggested it was too light. Being somewhat bullheaded, I kept fishing it and continued to lose fish as Jim was hooking up consistently. Aaron handed me an Ugly Stik and explained I'd get better hook penetration. My success rate a take-home souvenir. vastly improved, making me a believer in the Shakespeare Ugly Stik on the Situk.

After easy river-limits Jim and I were still ambitious and decided it was time to launch a lodge skiff and troll for silvers around Point Munoz. We rigged with 4-ounce keel weights and a cut-plug herring and "let 'em twirl." Before long we nailed our first silver and immediately started to mooch the area. We used this technique until dinnertime, filling our daily possession limit and adding another fun-filled chapter to our adventure.

Discussing our next day's plans, Captain Ralph suggested that when in Yakutat, see all there is to see—and that includes the Hubbard Glacier. This became our plan, as the weather predictions include 4 inches of rain, 12-foot swells and 30 mph winds. We battened down the hatches, dressed for success and headed out. With luck, we figured we would fish on the way home.

We embarked on our 31-mile trek to the Russel Fiord via Disenchantment Bay. Madame Hooker's twin Mercury 200 Optimax motors effortlessly pushed the boat through the swells and chop as Ralph selected the scenic shoreline's calmer waters. Wildlife was everywhere, as we saw several sea otters, a black bear working the shoreline and dozens and dozens of bald eagles.

The Hubbard Glacier is the longest glacier in North America that terminates in saltwater. The glacier is 300 feet tall, 7 miles wide and 76 miles deep and one of the few glaciers that is actually advancing.

Ralph cruises the Kingfisher in close proximity to the glacier, offering an up-closeand-personal view. Free-drifting in sheer solitude, we witnessed several small-scale calvings, which each create a thunderous crash. Floating icebergs filled the fjord and drifted into the bay, some as big as a VW Bug. Jim even snagged a 20-pound iceberg as

For halibut fishing, we headed to an area known as Africa. It gets its name because the bottom contour looks like the namesake country. Jim was using bait and I was eagerly jigging. Fishing was steady, but the fish were all the smaller variety, and we were looking for something a bit beefier. Finally Jim hooked up with a fatty that made it to Ralph's waiting shotgun. The 46-inch, 50-pounder was dispatched and added to the fish box. As the tide turned, my jig finally stuck hard. She put up a good fight, proving my Uncle Grumpy right when he said, "Dynamite comes in small packages." Boated, she weighed in just less than 40 pounds...and our halibut tags


Flying out in the afternoon affords the Yakutat angler the unique ability to still fish before departure, so we con guide Aaron into a half-day trip on our last day.

With an early launch, we quickly rowed past most of the other anglers, bumping into our friends Dave, Molly and Brady, "The Kid Reporter" (who makes his debut on page 114 of this issue). Dave had just landed a fly-caught silver and Brady's rod was doubled over. Fishing was excellent in the lower river, Jim casting spinners and me with my spoon, catching the biggest fish of our trip. After 2 ½ days on the Situk it's obvious why it's such a storied river, and why Aaron keeps coming back.

After a productive week of catching, our fish boxes weigh-in at 250 pounds. Having flown Alaska Airlines before, strategy prevails when organizing your luggage. Your first two bags run the standard \$25 rate, but when you add a third bag the price jumps to \$75 and that bag can weigh up to 100 pounds. We purchased a 100-pound fish box from Yakutat Seafoods and checked in one suitcase, three 50-pound fish boxes, and one 100-pound fish box, saving \$75. Suffice to say, our carry-ons were full.

Yakutat is a majestic land of pristine beauty, like no other place in the world. A special thanks to our guides and the entire staff at Yakutat Lodge for creating a lifetime of memories, a fabulous birthday and a freezer full of fish.

Fish Alaska Recipe

Togarashi Black Cod with Kale Kimchi and Black Garlic Aioli

Recipe by Kevin Lane, The Cookery, Seward



Makes 4 servings Time: 45 minutes (plus fermenting time)

Prepare kimchi at least five days before serving, if possible. Recipe makes more than you will need, but the kimchi will keep stored in an airtight container in the refrigerator for at least two weeks. You can substitute sweet rice flour and sugar with one large ripe pear and one tablespoon Alaska honey.

Ingredients

2 tbsp canola oil, divided

1 onion, halved and thinly sliced 4 (6-ounce) portions wild Alaska black cod

(sablefish), preferably skinless

2 tsp salt

2 tsp shichimi togarashi (Japanese 7-spice mix)

1 tbsp black sesame seeds

Alaska Kale Kimchi (see recipe) Black Garlic Aioli (see recipe)

Preheat oven to 400°F. Toss together 1 tablespoon oil with onion slices; spread evenly across the bottom of an oven-proof dish. Place black cod on top of onions. Brush with remaining canola oil and season evenly with salt and togarashi. Bake until cooked through, about 18 minutes. Sprinkle with sesame seeds and serve with Alaska Kale Kimchi and Black Garlic Aioli.

Kale Kimchi

2 bunches Alaska-grown kale

1/2 cup kosher salt

3 cups water

1/2 cup sweet rice flour

1/4 cup sugar

1 Alaska-grown red onion, peeled, julienne cut 2 Alaska-grown carrots, peeled, julienne cut

2 Alaska-grown turnips, peeled, julienne cut 2 ounces fresh ginger (about a 2-inch long piece), peeled, grated

4 garlic cloves, peeled, minced

4 Serrano chilies with seeds, stems removed, chopped

1 cup garlic chili paste

2 bunches green onions, trimmed, cut into 1-inch pieces

Remove kale leaves from stems, discarding stems. Rinse leaves and cut into 2-inch pieces. Place leaves in a large bowl; sprinkle with salt. With clean hands, rub salt into kale to break down the leaves. Let sit at room temperature for 2 hours. While kale is resting, place water, rice flour and sugar in a medium saucepan; bring to a simmer, stirring constantly until thickened, about 4 minutes. Remove from heat; set aside to cool. After 2 hours, rinse and drain kale. Stir rice flour mixture and remaining ingredients together; mix thoroughly with kale. Place mixture in a clean glass or plastic container with a tight-fitting lid, cover and let sit at room temperature for 12- to 24 hours to ferment. Refrigerate for at least 4 days before serving.

Black garlic, used in Asian cooking, is made of whole bulbs of garlic "fermented" over several weeks. The flavor is slightly sweet and pungent.

Black Garlic Aioli

6 black garlic cloves, peeled

2 large Alaska-grown egg yolks

1 tbsp soy sauce

1/2 tsp kosher salt

1 tbsp fresh lime juice

1 cup olive oil

Place garlic, egg yolks, soy sauce, salt and lime juice in a blender and puree until smooth. With , motor running, very słowły drizzle in oil until thick and mayonnaise-like. Cover and refrigerate until ready to use.



The boat is weighed down with halibut by the time we start to harder to catch silver salmon, but much easier fish for coho salmon. There's blood from the object in the boat stinks. It doesn't matter if



to hook a dog salmon. We were also lucky that fish all over the floor, and pretty much every the boat stinks more than hell itself, it was one of the best times of my life, a time that I will always cherish, and the fish taste delicious.

We started back to the bay after catching our fish, which didn't take long. As Charlie, an employee for the lodge in Yakutat, was getting our fish off the boat, we watched as people filleted the other boats' catch. We did a pretty good job of catching fish ourselves. The fact is we caught so many coho salmon that we had to put two fish on the same hook for a majority of the dock's hanger hooks to take the picture. We did well trying to catch halibut in deeper water. One man caught a 43-pound halibut while jigging. Luckily, everybody caught at least 10 fish each. My friend, Troy, told me that the cheek of the halibut was the best meat and pointed it out every time they filleted a new fish. Finally, we had our picture taken. It took some time to take our photo due to how many fish we caught.




Every dinner and breakfast were phenomenal compared to what I get at home. At dinner we ate just about any type of seafood you could think of, and boy they prepared it well.
